## New Mayor

**A**t the Annual Council Meeting on 8 May, Cllr Mrs Julie Mockford was elected as the new East Grinstead Town Mayor.

Having represented Baldwins Ward for the Town Council since 2015, Julie also served as Vice Chairman for the Public Services committee during 2015 and 2016.

As well as chairing the Council meetings (the office of Chairman of the Council is the legal duty, but as a Town Council, we are entitled to call our Chairman 'Town Mayor'), the Mayor will seek to raise funds for charities by hosting regular fundraisers. Julie's chosen charities for the year and her reasons for choosing them are:

**Queen Victoria Hospital**  
'I intend to raise money for signage, and way-finding lines, which will show people where we have come from, where we are and where we, as a hospital, are going. Patients often say 'the place is a maze!' To which I answer, yes, but it's also amazing! I'm proud to work there and even more proud to support it.'

**Chequer Mead**  
'Having been a dance and drama teacher (in a past life) and having 'trod the boards' on many occasions in the theatre with Company of Friends, East Grinstead Operatic Society and Roshe, I want to ensure that this jewel in the crown of East Grinstead remains in the town for future generations to use and love.'

**The Myfanwy Townsend Melanoma Trust**

'I knew Myfanwy through the Operatic Society, where we performed in productions. I admire her husband, Harry, immensely for his phenomenal fundraising following her death from this disease. I want people to be aware of this dreadful disease that is on the increase and try, through fundraising and research, to find a cure.'

## Sussex Police Public Contact Point and Policing Base opens at Chequer Mead

On 6 March the local policing team moved from the Police Station in East Court to the annexe of the Chequer Mead Arts Centre. The move forms part of a strategy to ensure we have the optimum mix of buildings in the right locations, including co-location with partners, to deliver the best service possible to the public. The current policing site in East Grinstead sits some distance away outside the town centre and will be sold. By moving into the Chequer Mead Arts Centre we are looking to increase the visibility and accessibility of staff and officers in the local team, save money by being co-located and improve local engagement with communities.

The approach to local policing is changing, due in part to the way some crime is committed, including cybercrime, fraud and scams. As a police force, we recognise the need to keep pace of advances in technology and how the public gain access to services and information as a result. In addition to having a strong digital footprint, we also want to ensure that police buildings are modern, well-equipped and in the locations where the public need them most.



Chief Inspector Rosie Ross, District Commander for Crawley and Mid Sussex, said: 'Having a public contact point and neighbourhood policing base in the Chequer Mead Arts Centre means services will be easier to access. This is because the police will be in a more convenient position in the centre of the town where there is a considerably greater footfall. It also means working more closely with partners for a joined-up approach. A modern workplace for our staff and partners will assist in promoting positive, open and trusting relationships, making us more efficient and effective with our service to the public.'

'Any development and changes to Sussex Police Estates is not being progressed in isolation. Decisions are also informed by the Force's 'Local Policing Plan' with the aim of delivering a service that is sustainable and flexible to deal with future demand. We face a continued challenge of greatly reducing our costs while maintaining a service that protects the public, keeps communities safe, catches criminals and places victims at the heart of policing.'

## Christine steps down from her HAMSVA role

**C**hief Officer Christine Hardisty has retired from the **Horsham and Mid-Sussex Voluntary Action Charity (HAMSVA)** after serving for twelve years in the organisation. **Sue Edgson, currently the volunteer coordinator, has been appointed to take over from Christine.**

HAMSVA provides a first-class service to voluntary and community groups in a variety of ways. They match people who want to volunteer with organisations that need their time and skill. They coordinate open meetings, training events, seminars and consultations so that voluntary groups can meet and exchange ideas. They help groups and small businesses to access

When asked what advice groups most often seek from HAMSVA, Christine explained: 'Groups always ask us how to get funding and how to recruit more volunteers. These are two vital requirements and HAMSVA is able to provide plenty of support and advice.'
