East Grinstead remembers

THERE will be a wreath-laying ceremony at the town war memorial in East Court at 4.30pm on 9 July to commemorate the 70th anniversary of the Whitehall bombing.

The town mayor and councillors will also attend a minute's silence to be held outside the Whitehall building in the London Road at 5pm.

Victims will be remembered at a Civic service at St Swithun's at 10.30am on Sunday 14 July, which will be followed by a picnic in the vicarage gardens.

The service will be conducted by the newly enthroned Bishop of Chichester, the Right Rev Martin Warner, on his first episcopal visit to East Grinstead.

Those killed and maimed will also be honoured in the High Street which will be planted with white blooms in their memory this summer.

On 9 July 1943, ten German aircraft entered English airspace over Hastings and headed on a bombing run to London.

At 5.05pm the air raid sirens sounded in East Grinstead - it was teatime and the Whitehall Cinema in the London Road had an audience of 184 people, many of them children watching a showing of Hopalong Cassidy after school.


A warning was flashed up on-screen but few of the audience took any notice of it and remained in their seats.

Five minutes later one of the German planes lost contact with the others and the pilot decided to find a new target before turning for home.

He first fired on a train entering East Grinstead station, then circled the area twice before dropping his load on the town centre.

One bomb hit the cinema, others landed on shops in the High Street and London Road, killing 108 people and seriously injuring 235 more. It was the largest loss of life in any WWII air raid in Sussex.

WEST Sussex County Council is looking for warm and loving homes for some of the county's most vulnerable youngsters. Anyone who would like to know more about fostering can attend one of the regular monthly drop-in sessions at locations across the county. Foster homes offer children a stable family environment while their own parents are unable to look after them. Their stay with foster carers may be short or long term, and the County Council tries to place them near home so they can remain at school with their friends, and close to the places and people they

know best. This means the Council is always on the lookout for new carers to come forward from across West Sussex. People from a variety of backgrounds can apply to foster, regardless of their marital status or sexuality, if they have a good sense of humour, patience, energy and the ability to treat children and young people as individuals. Carers receive a comprehensive support package, including ongoing training and allowances.

Make it for McIndoe

AN appeal has been launched to raise £175,000 for a statue of pioneering plastic surgeon Sir Archibald McIndoe. The scale model maquette pictured shows McIndoe with an anonymous airman (one of his Guinea Pigs) above an inscription referring to his work and the role of East Grinstead as the town "that did not stare". The complete piece includes a bench for visitors to sit and reflect on the work.

Donations are being accepted via a special website www.mcindoememorial.com.

The Town Council is working alongside the Blond McIndoe Research Centre, East Grinstead Business Association, and the McIndoe family to steer the project, although it is to be funded through donations made to the appeal.

The sculptor is Martin Jennings whose father was treated by the team at the QVH following burns he sustained during the war. Should the donations be sufficient it is hoped that the statue will be in place by spring 2014.
