The Council hereby notify you that they **REFUSE** to permit the above development as shown in the submitted application and plans.

The reasons for the Council's decision are:-

1. The proposed side and rear extension by virtue of its design, scale and appearance would not be of a high quality design and would be out of keeping with the character of the dwelling. In addition the extension would appear out of keeping with the street scene due to its contemporary design within a fairly uniformed traditional wider character. The proposal therefore conflicts with Policy DP26 of the Mid Sussex District Plan, Policy EG3 of the East Grinstead Neighbourhood Plan, Design Principles DG49 and DG50 of the Mid Sussex Design Guide and the National Planning Policy Framework.
2. The proposed side and rear extensions would by reason of their scale and design and close relationship with the adjacent designated heritage assets cause less than substantial harm to the setting of both the adjacent Conservation Area and Listed Building. The extensions would not provide any public benefits that would outweigh the identified harm to the setting of both the Conservation Area and Listed Building.

The proposal therefore conflicts with policies DP34 and DP35 of the Mid Sussex District Plan, policy EG4 of the East Grinstead Neighbourhood Plan, Section 66 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 and the relevant paragraphs of the National Planning Policy Framework.

Notes for Applicants

If you are aggrieved by the decision of your Local Planning Authority to refuse permission for the proposed development or to grant it subject to conditions, then you can appeal to the Secretary of State under Section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

As this is a decision to refuse planning permission for a householder application, if you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision then you must do so within **12 weeks** of the date of this notice.

However, if

- (i) this is a decision on a planning application relating to the same or substantially the same land and development as is already the subject of an enforcement notice, and you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision on your application, then you must do so within 28 days of the date of this notice; or
- (ii) an enforcement notice is subsequently served relating to the same or substantially the same land and development as in your application and if you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision on your application, then you must do so within:
 - 28 days of the date of service of the enforcement notice, or
 - within 6 months (12 weeks in the case of a householder appeal) of the date of this notice, whichever period expires earlier.
