




Staff moves


he annual summer planting schemes in the High Street flower beds for 2018 commemorate local and national anniversaries.

RAFI00

April 2018 marked the centenary of the formation of the Royal Air Force, making it the oldest Independent Air Force in the world. It was formed by the amalgamation of the Royal Flying Corps and the Royal Naval Air Service. The RAF motto is per ardua ad astra (through adversity to the stars).

The bed depicts three plumes, representing the coloured smoke often emitted by the Red Arrows (RAF aerobatic team); one each in red, white and blue and the RAF100 logo. The model planes depict WWI bi-planes, WW2 Spitfires and modern day Typhoons.

100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE END OF WWI

In 2014 the Town Council commemorated the anniversary of the beginning of WWI with spectacular themed beds depicting poppies. These Beds won a prize in the South East in Bloom's Best War Memorial competition.

Inspired by the poppies at the Tower of London in 2014, this year, the beds take the 2014 theme to new heights. The War Memorial bed will mark the 100th anniversary of the end of hostilities and the planting will remain in situ throughout the remainder of 2018. On Remembrance Sunday, 11 November, the lighting of a Beacon will be shown on a big screen during the High St Service of Remembrance.

Please do not remove the props in the beds, as it spoils the overall showcase and enjoyment of others. If you are interested in owning any of them post display, please contact the Town Council directly.



EAST GRINSTEAD AND DISTRICT LIONS

East Grinstead Lions Club was formed in 1968, and 2018 sees the club reach its Golden Anniversary. The bed marks this milestone with the Lion's logo; the heads facing both ways to represent pride in heritage and confidence in the future. The club is very active in the town, organising the annual May Fair and Donkey Derby. Its members give over 3800 voluntary hours per year, and over the 50 years have raised and donated more than £1 million to local, national and international charities.

The Lion's mission statement is "to create and foster a spirit of understanding among all people for humanitarian needs by providing voluntary services through community involvement and international co-operation."

JOHN MASON NEALE - WARDEN OF SACKVILLE COLLEGE

2018 marks the 200th anniversary of the birth of John Mason Neale, Warden of Sackville College between 1846 and his death in 1866. During his time as warden he translated many ancient and medieval hymns from Latin and Greek and wrote many original hymns. He also wrote lyrics for the carol Good King Wenceslas drawing inspiration from Ashdown Forest, which was visible from his study window (Still the Warden's Study today). He is buried in St Swithun's churchyard where an elaborate tomb marks his memory.

The planting takes inspiration from Good King Wenceslas and depicts the King and his page setting out against the winter's wild weather to take sustenance to an old man he saw gathering winter fuel.
