Refurbishment of Pedestrian Crossing

West Sussex County Council needs to carry out road works close to your property soon and we are contacting you today to let you know what we are doing.

What we're doing

For this project we will be:

- Upgrading the obsolete Pelican Crossing on London Road near Beeching Way.
- Upgrading obsolete traffic signals equipment with new poles, traffic signals controller and more energy efficient LED traffic signal heads.
- Conversion to a Puffin style crossing which improves safety for users & reduces delay to motorists.
- Pedestrian tactile paving is to be replaced.

When this will take place

The work will start on 4th May 2020 and is expected to take two weeks to complete. Our hours of work will generally be between 8:30 am and 17:00.

Before the works start, we will erect advance warning signs in the local area, letting you know any changes to the start date and marking the extent of the works.

Road Restrictions during the work

In order to protect our workforce and the public:

- 24hr traffic management will be required and will remain onsite for the duration of the work.
