South East Water south east water gives additional support

or the second year running South East Water is partnering with East Grinstead Town Council and will be out and about in the area talking about the schemes on offer which can save money and water.

The company, which supplies your clean drinking water, has also invested £850,000 over the past year in upgrading the town's water supply pipes, with Queen's Road finishing ahead of scheduleopening the road two months earlier than expected.

In addition, 21 charities and community organisations across the town have shared a £100,000 donation from South East Water including the East Grinstead Food Bank, Age UK East Grinstead and District and Jigsaw (South East Bereavement Charity) Tanya Sephton, Customer Services Director, South East Water, said: "Saving money is now crucial for a large number of our customers so that's why this partnership with East Grinstead Town Council is even more important as we enter into its second year."

As part of this continued relationship, South East Water will be out and about in the town and working with local charities and support groups, giving advice on financial support tariffs for people struggling to pay water bills and how to save water and lower energy bills. If you need help with paying your water bills get in touch by ringing 0800 952 4000.



The team will be at East Court Live again this year, ready to talk about all things water. It will also be at regular High Street events to support those most needing the extra help.

"On the website we have a number of free water saving devices including regulated shower heads and water saving gels for garden plants. There are also Leaky Loo detection strips which could save up to 300 litres of water a day." The devices can be ordered at southeastwater.co.uk/freedevices

People can also check **southeastwater.co.uk/priority** to see if they are eligible for the Priority Services Register which offers additional support with water supply, managing water accounts and gives prior warning of any planned works.
