It is due to be presented in draft form to the Council on 7 January and will then embark on an open consultation for 6 weeks. After the consultation period ends, the final Plan will be presented to the Council meeting on 8 April, and if agreed, will go to Mid Sussex District Council for examination and referendum. Residents will be able to vote for or against the Plan later in 2013,

Bluebell Railway on track to arrive this Spring

IT has taken almost 30 years and cost millions of pounds, but thanks to the faith and enthusiasm of countless steam train enthusiasts the Bluebell Railway's northern extension into East Grinstead mainline station will finally be finished this Spring.

The multi-million pound project means that for the first time ever, visitors from London will be able to connect directly to the Bluebell Line.

Welcoming the "unprecedented delivery of one of the south east's major tourist attractions direct to our doorstep" Town Promotions Officer Simon Kerr said: "It certainly is very much of a game-changer for the town's tourism prospects, and we will have a busy year putting plans into action and working with the Bluebell Railway to plan for the longer term. We are already preparing a special *Welcome to the Bluebell* edition of our annual tourism leaflet which is distributed throughout the South East, and we anticipate integrating more and more town events for the new visitor stream which will be arriving in the town. This is a marvellous opportunity which I hope East Grinstead will seize with both hands."

Stuart Scholes of the East Grinstead Business Association agreed. "Independent research indicates that a substantial percentage of Bluebell visitors will also venture into East Grinstead to visit cafes, restaurants and shops so we need to be ready to welcome them and to show that we are a destination in our own right."

Council Leader Norman Webster also welcomed the long-awaited arrival of the Bluebell into the station. "This historic opportunity will inject much-needed growth into the town economy during a long downturn across the nation, and must be welcomed wholeheartedly by the business community and by everyone who cares about the future of East Grinstead."

Street Pastors keep town centre safe

TEAMS of Street Pastors will be patrolling the town centre on Friday and Saturday evenings alongside the police from the end of February.

The Pastors, who are all volunteers from *Churches Together in East Grinstead*, will work in pairs from 6pm until the early hours each night, as a Christian presence on the streets to help anyone who may be in need of assistance.

The scheme was pioneered in London by the Rev Les Isaac as a response to urban problems including late night drunkenness and violence, and has seen remarkable results including a drop in crime in areas where teams are deployed.

Volunteers, who are CRB checked and have references from their local parish churches, are trained by the Ascension Trust of which Rev Isaacs is the chairman. They are organised by a local coordinator, with support from the police, the Town Council and other agencies.



Pop-up surgery in the High Street

TOWN councillors are making themselves more accessible to East Grinstead residents by taking to the streets once a month with a new mobile "surgery" where they can meet people and give advice on public services. They will be on the High Street on the first Saturday of each month between 10 – 11.30am, and will also be available from time to time to deal with specific issues of concern to the public. County, district and town councillors will also continue to attend some surgeries at the town library in West Street (ask for the rota at the library).

PLANS are afoot to remember all those townspeople killed during WWII. This year marks the 70th anniversary of the Whitehall cinema bombing which took place on 9 July, 1943, in which 108 people died and 235 were seriously injured, the largest loss of life in any air raid in Sussex. Plans for the anniversary include planting white flowers in the beds around the High Street war memorial and a service of remembrance for the victims.

Ready, get set, go... for the Sussex Living Marathon

THE Sussex Living Marathon Weekend will be back in May.

Three different races will take place at East Grinstead, Haywards Heath and Burgess Hill over a combined distance equalling the classic 26.2 miles Marathon challenge. Races can be entered individually or as a three-race series, and participants completing all three races will receive a medal.

The three races are at:

East Grinstead: 10 miles on Saturday 4 May Haywards Heath: 10 miles on Sunday 5 May

Burgess Hill: 10k on Monday 6 May

All three races are staged using roads, pathways, trails and footpaths around beautiful Mid Sussex countryside. Routes are largely traffic-free, and will suit runners of all standards, but not wheelchair athletes. There will also be a team relay option with three people running approximately 3.3 miles each, and children's races. CHEQUER Mead has launched a £60,000 appeal to refurbish its auditorium in a two-stage programme over the coming months. "We've seen an awful lot of bottoms on a great many seats over the past 15 years," laughed manager Nick Byrne, "so the time has come to look at replacing them and the worn carpet." Nick hopes patrons who enjoy the huge range of activities on offer at the theatre will give generously to the appeal. Anyone who donates the £100 cost of replacing a single seat will be honoured on a wallmounted plaque.

THE town's Jubilee celebrations raised £2,400.25 which has been given to local charities including Meridian Radio, the Lions Club, the Museum and the Rotary Club.

FOLLOWING its highly successful scheme to offer residents cut-price alarms for sheds and other outbuildings, Mid Sussex District Council has come up with a new 'handbag' alarm to improve personal safety.

TOWN Clerk Julie Holden has appealed for witnesses to town centre accidents to report drivers' details to the police. Protective railings outside Lloyds Bank in the London Road have been repeatedly damaged in recent years by articulated lorries, and the cost of replacing them may in future fall on the Town Council unless it can be reclaimed from the drivers' own insurance, said Julie.
