## **VE Day Celebrations in The High Street**

THIS May will mark the 70th anniversary of Victory in Europe (VE) Day, the final unconditional surrender by Germany which brought a formal end to World War II in Europe.

By the end of the conflict between 60 and 80 million people had died, including six million Jews in Nazi concentration camps, those who had died from warrelated disease and deprivation, and up to 25 million military personnel, of whom five million had died while prisoners of war.

This year's 70th anniversary will be a particularly poignant one as it is likely to be the last at which those who actually served in the war will be present in any significant numbers.

So, to recall this landmark in the country's history, there will be a unique VE Day commemoration with a street party in the High Street on **Sunday, 10 May**.

The ConChord Big Band will be there to play 40's tunes, and the Spinettes, a



wartime-inspired close harmony trio, will be also be performing.

Starting the entertainment will be Adam, the Magic Music Man performing for the youngsters, and our own Meridian FM will fill in and act as compere.

Free tables and chairs, pre-booked on a first come, first served basis with the Town Council, will be available in the High



Street, where there will be a limited bar, and refreshments including hot dogs and burgers.

The town centre bars and cafes will be open for business, and will be joining in the fun.

People attending the event, which will start at 4pm and end at 9pm, are encouraged to wear period dress.

## Vote, Vote, Vote...

WITH National, District and Town elections coming up on **Thursday 7 May**, East Grinstead residents need to ensure they are on the electoral register.

Everyone is responsible for registering themselves, and it can be done very simply online at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote

To check if your name is on the register contact the Electoral Services officer on 01444 477003, who will also tell you how to register to vote by post if you need to do so. Or email elections@midsussex.gov.uk

To qualify for a vote you much be a citizen of Great Britain, Ireland or a Commonwealth country and be aged 18 or over.

Citizens of European Union states may vote in local elections but are not eligible to vote for UK MPs.

The Town North and Town South Wards will be merged into a single Town Ward at the next election, and will be represented by four councillors instead of the present three, bringing the total number of town councillors to 19.

\*Polling stations can occasionally change venue, so don't forget to check your Polling card for details of where to go to vote on Election Day.

#### **Gatwick Consultation**



The Council voted on Monday 2nd February to approve their consultation submission to the Davies Commission.

In a covering letter to accompany the response, Cllr Whittaker (Leader of the Council) said "This Council finds that grave reservations as to the impact on the existing environment and community of a two runway airport at Gatwick have not been mitigated. At this stage it would appear to this Council that the commission have underestimated the potential negative impact on a beautiful natural mostly rural area, underestimated the costs needed to bring this option to Gatwick in local infrastructure, and over-estimated the economic benefits. The East Grinstead Town Council would oppose the Gatwick Option being pursued."
